

BOARD REPORT

The board which has been effectively progressing for over three years has continued to work on building and strengthening their knowledge and expertise. All of the members, both founding and new, have worked together in conjunction with staff using their skills and commitment to GEWA in an ongoing mission to end Violence against Women. Despite various financial challenges in 2013/14 GEWA have continued to provide an excellent service for women, children and young people throughout the North East of Glasgow. Much of the success of GEWA is attributed to the dedication and enthusiasm of all members, employees and volunteers. Always aiming to progress and move forward, GEWA continues to maintain high standards and successful services in an ever changing financial climate.

REFUGE

Providing a safe shelter to women and families fleeing abuse is an extremely vital service provided at GEWA. We have 5 flats which are continuously full. GEWA refuge staff Ann and Kim make the space they have to offer women, warm, safe, welcolming and somewhere women and families can regroup and recover in a way that is both person centred and needs led.

There are a range of activities incorporated in the refuge stay including counselling support, practical assistance such as budgeting and healthy eating, parenting support and goal setting for the future. These types of support are essential in the recovery – most women have experienced no financial autonomy, parenting decisions or being independent.

The women meet up for a coffee morning and peer support regularly, there is always opportunity for the families to access activities that promote their self-esteem and wellbeing.

WOMEN'S THERAPEUTIC COUNSELLING

AND SUPPORT SERVICE

Again in 2013/14, one of the most valued services was the Women's Therapeutic Counselling and support Service, which is provided by GEWA workers Anne, Janice and Mairead who have many years of experience specialising in their own areas of expertise. The need for this area of support is highlighted by the continual growth in the number of referrals for women and families. The counselling and support services are offered from our main office and on an outreach basis covering the North East sector of Glasgow

GEWA services are devised to support the ever changing requirements of women in today's society. We work with women affected by addiction, childhood sexual abuse, rape and sexual assault.

We recognise that women who are survivors of domestic abuse and or any of the other issues are more likely to use drugs or alcohol as a coping mechanism. Addiction can be prevalent in women living with domestic abuse. Compared to non-abused women, survivors of domestic abuse are 15 times more likely to abuse alcohol and 9 times more likely to abuse drugs therefore, this strand of support within GEWA is highly relevant.

As statistics from GEWA in 2006 revealed, the correlation between adult survivors of domestic abuse and the likelihood of experiencing childhood sexual abuse which show that for every 10 women referred for the women's service 6 had experienced some form of childhood sexual abuse. Providing services to women affected by this is integral to meeting the needs of women using the service.

CHILDREN'S & YOUNG PEOPLE'S WORK

GEWA's children services are continuously in high demand due to the prevalence of domestic abuse in the North East of Glasgow and in-depth knowledge and attitude of the key workers Gillian and Gemma who are

based in the main office and Karen, based at our refuge. Along with the main children's service there are 2 sessional staff members at refuge and as a team all children's workers work towards a wide range of activities and events for the children and young people to take part in helping them when they are recovering from the effects of domestic abuse.

Any child aged between 5 and 18 who has experienced or is affected by domestic abuse can be referred to the excellent variety of activities on offer such as:



- Age appropriate resources provided in one to one sessions
- Group work focusing on various themes including self-esteem and safety, which aim to assist in recovery
- Outings which encourage social interaction, exercise and outdoor experiences

One of the most popular and rewarding activities is the Hopscotch holiday for some children who have been engaged with GEWA throughout the year. For many children this once in a lifetime experience provides a range of outdoor pursuits which helps to build confidence and self-esteem as well as forming friendships with other young people.

FAMILY DEVELOPMENT SERVICE

Building on our initial 3 year funding form The Big Lottery Fund Scotland Eleanor has been dedicated to the development of family work within GEWA.

Family dynamics change dramatically when a woman leaves an abusive situation with her children. This can cause great difficulty in keeping boundaries and structure that she may want to create with her children, often due to her lack of confidence in parenting because of the changing situation.

A role of the Family Development worker is to help the family unite after abuse, support Mum in her role as a parent. Eleanor will assist with finding a sense of safety and stability for the entire family. Eleanor provides individual support for women and children and as a family unit. Taking a person centred individual approach to all aspects of her work.

We hope to continue with this vital work and will look to extend our funding when this funding is due to end in March 2015.

• It is with huge sadness that we said Happy Retirement to GEWAs longest serving sister when Mairead decided to call it a day and allegedly put her feet up. Mairead has proved invaluable and has been at the forefront of change in statutory responses to victims of Domestic Abuse. She has also been at the helm of many changes through her years in GEWA. She will also be remembered by many, many women whom she stood their ground for when they were unable to do so. Giving them a voice when no one else would. We wish her every success in her future ventures where she will continue her private work in the field, supporting women and children and delivering specialised training. On a personal level she will also be remembered for her spectacular lunches!

MULTI-AGENCY APPROACH

GEWA has operated within a multi-agency context since formation, and as the years have passed the organisation has maintained a pro- active approach in being involved in local strategic groups and partnerships. Pamela is the current multi-agency development worker who represents GEWA at the Glasgow Violence Against Women Partnership, the North East Violence Against Women Implementation Group and a range of themed sub groups to ensure GEWA has a presence and input to service delivery development and decisions affecting women, children and young people in Glasgow East.

The 10 week unpaid worker course continues to be an ongoing success.

The programme enables women to volunteer in GEWA allowing women to improve their confidence and employability skills.

One of the most popular events this year at GEWA was the INTERNATIONAL LADIES DAY on 8th March 2014 when we held our "TEA PARTY" with all the women using the services enjoying this special occasion.
